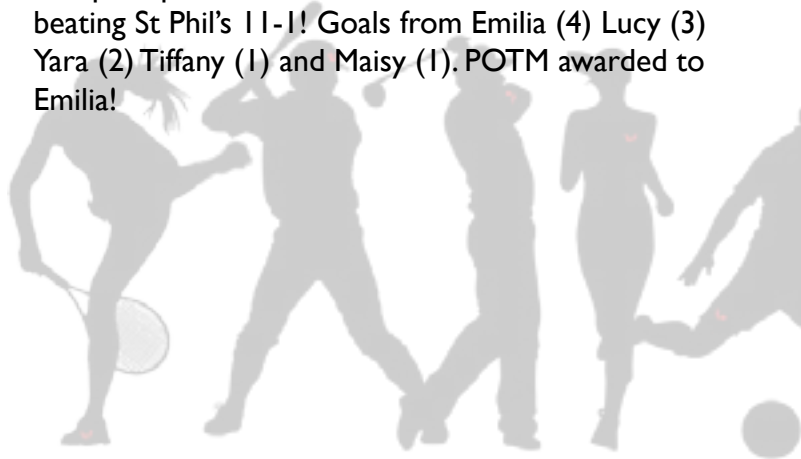

## U-16 FOOTBALL TEAM BEAT ST.PHIL'S

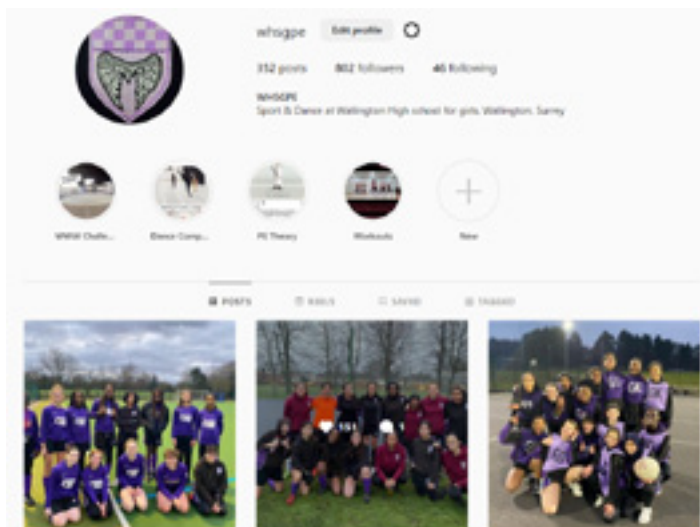
